### 2022 Highlights!

2022 was full of lots of successes. Oshkosh Healthy Neighborhoods collaborated with different groups in Oshkosh to create three new neighborhoods. Downtown, Green Acres, and Historic 6th Ward were

officially recognized in 2022!

Community Building and Engagement dollars (CB&E) are used by the neighborhoods to host events, beautification, and much more. Each neighborhood is allocated \$1,000 annually to help with community development within their neighborhood. 2022 was full of growth with neighborhoods spending \$7,364.97! in neighborhood building and engagement.











Of course we can't forget all of our wonderful volunteers in 2022. We had over **1,400** volunteers working to better their neighborhood. This added up to **2,516** hours in their neighborhoods! We want to thank each of these members who work constantly with us to create a healthy, happy and safe place to live!

Another part of our organizations success is our Good Neighbor Grants. These grants are for individuals who live in a neighborhood association. It is a curb appeal grant in which you can apply for during the spring season. It is a \$750.00 reimbursement grant for any and all curb appeal with no restrictions besides needing to live in a city recognized neighborhood association. In 2022 there was a total of \$136,752 improvements within neighborhoods. We are looking to continue the expansion of this grant so keep a look out in 2023!
