

Good Neighbor Grant

The Good Neighbor Grant program led to over \$135,000 in improvements throughout our neighborhood associations. The focus of the program is on curb appeal projects visible from the street. After providing the first \$250, the grant recipient is eligible for up to \$750 from Oshkosh Healthy Neighborhoods to help complete the project. All residents of recognized neighborhood associations are eligible. Applications will be reviewed from April 15 to June 15. They are available at our website: gohni.org. The process is first come first serve so applications will go fast! This program is supported by the City of Oshkosh, the JEK Foundation, and the Otto Bremer Trust in which we are extremely grateful for their partnership. Great Neighborhoods Grant Program

The Great Neighborhoods Program helps to enhance the image, market, and physical conditions of Oshkosh neighborhoods. The program provides residents the opportunity to create large scale projects that enhance quality of life in their communities. While working in collaboration with City staff, residents initiate, plan, and implement projects and activities within their neighborhoods. This program is meant for neighborhoods to reach for the stars with projects they want accomplish. Below are the dates to the program:

April 11-May 12, 2023 - NAs meet with City staff to go over their ideas for potential projects

May 15-June 16, 2023- GNP application is open

June 16, 2023 - GNP applications are due

June 19-July 7, 2023- City employees review GNP applications to ensure all necessary information is submitted

July 10-July 14, 2023- GNP Review Team meets and scores the applications

July 25 OR August 8, 2023- GNP projects on Common Council agenda for consideration of approval Great neighborhoods start with you!
