### Welcome and Announcements (Cora Strand, Neighborhood Coordinator):

Cora started the meeting by introducing Emma Dziengeleski and Emma Jansky. We asked neighbors to warmly welcome them. She also reminded everyone about the website calendar, explained how to reach the calendar and how to add events. Cora also showed the different neighborhood pages and how to edit them by requesting an update. Everyone is able to add events and can add details like descriptions/dates/price.

# N.E.W. Dragon Boat Festival (Angie Lee):

Angie started by giving background information about the dragon boats and described it as a multicultural event. The event will focus on community engagement, diverse food options and performances. Angie shared results from a survey that reported only 32% of city residents describe Oshkosh as diverse and inclusive. One of the goals of this festival is to create a more welcoming atmosphere for all. Regarding the dragon boat races, Angie explained that many

different organizations will be invited to form teams and compete. To make the event a success, they need as many as 200 volunteers. This is a great way for neighborhoods to participate. Angle is also interested in hearing ideas we may have regarding other types of activities that might be popular at the event. Please share!

#### **Operations Coordinator (Emma Jansky):**

Emma introduced herself. She reminded attendees to report and turn in their volunteer hours, and encouraged everyone to let her know if they need Welcome Bags. Emma explained that she is looking to create a focus group to come up with ideas for more user-friendly volunteer tracking, and that anyone willing should email her with ideas at <u>emmaj@gohni.com</u>. She then announced changes to the application process for the Block Party Trailer. These changes include

-Neighborhoods can request trailer as many times as they want; if demand allows -Damages to the trailer will be taken out of CB&E funds

-Whomever requests trailer is responsible for pickup and dropoff

Emma also let everyone know that the BPT applications open on May 15, 2023.
