Neighborhood/National Night Out is a nationwide collaboration between neighborhoods and law enforcement. It occurs annually on the first Tuesday of August. The event is designed to create opportunities for community residents to have positive interactions with their local police and fire department staff members. Neighbors learn more about the people and equipment that protects them from harm. Neighborhood groups host the events, which have become very popular in Oshkosh.

This year Oshkosh residents hosted 19 block parties for this event, nine of which were located in recognized neighborhood associations. The night was a great success; neighborhoods collaborated with local businesses, musicians and restaurants to celebrate their communities. Staff from the Police and Fire departments traveled between events, greeting people and demonstrating the equipment they use to support the citizens of Oshkosh. The K9 police unit was especially popular!

Our neighborhoods are fortunate to enjoy this collaboration. We encourage all Oshkosh residents to participate in future NNOs. It is a wonderful opportunity for positive interactions with both your neighbors and our public servants.
