Spring Rally Discussion (Cora Strand):



Cora announced that the Spring Rally is scheduled for April 6th, a Saturday, from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, including lunch. The event will consist of three main sections, each with 3-4 small workshops. Associations are encouraged to send 4-5 representatives. The registration form was sent out on Friday the 16th, and a QR code was provided for immediate sign-up for those in attendance. OHN Updates (Tom Fojtik):

Tom discussed plans to revitalize neighborhood associations this spring with the Good Neighbor Grant. A notice was placed in The Herald, generating initial interest in the program. Applications will be accepted from April 15th to June 15th. While funds for 35 grants are currently available, efforts to secure additional funding are underway to increase this number by the application deadline. Tom also provided an update on the potential Urban Ecology Center in Oshkosh. As a committee member, he noted they've secured space at County Park but lack a 501(c)3 status. There are plans to partner with them, leveraging our status to aid in their funding applications. This collaboration is anticipated to be highly successful, and support for their endeavors is encouraged.
