# Oshkosh Healthy Neighborhoods (Tom Fojtik):

Tom provided an update on the Good Neighbor Grants. To date, we've completed 29 reimbursements and anticipate finalizing 35 by year-end. We're still working to reimburse uncompleted projects. Oshkosh Healthy Neighborhoods has also received a \$70,000 grant from the JEK Foundation, and we're very grateful for their ongoing support.

# Neighborhood Share (Cora Strand):

With time remaining, Neighborhood Coordinator Cora Strand invited neighborhood leaders to share recent events and projects. Congress Field, Bent Woods, and Historic Jackson collaborated on a Halloween "Safe Trick-or-Treat" event at the Legion, which had a fantastic turnout. They are now considering a holiday event for the group. Sacred Heart and Historic 6th Ward neighborhoods hosted a Trunk or Treat event, attracting over 400 community members with 14 participating cars.
